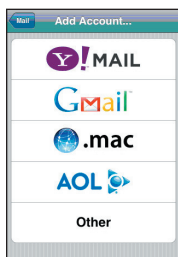


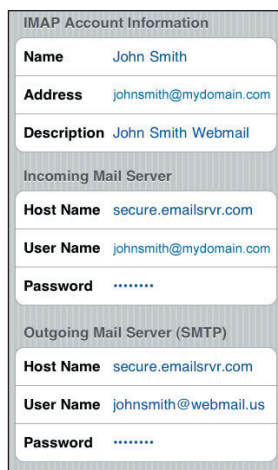
Setting Up iPhone™ Email

Setting Up an IMAP Email Account

1. Select [Settings / Mail / Add Account](#).
2. Click [Other](#), located at the bottom of the list.
3. Click the [IMAP](#) tab.
4. Enter the following information in the spaces provided:



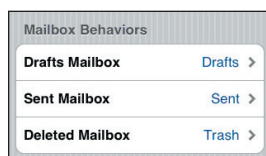
- Name—Enter your full first and last name, as you want it to be displayed in the emails you send.
- Address—Enter your full email address (e.g., *myname@mydomain.com*).
- Description—Enter a descriptive name for your account (e.g., *My Work Account*). This description will be visible only to you.



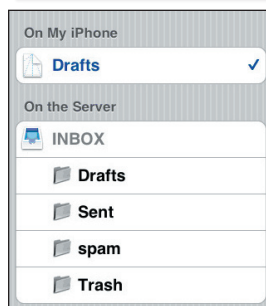
In both the [Incoming Mail Server](#) and [Outgoing Mail Server](#) sections, enter the following information:

- Host Name—Enter the name of the secure email server: *secure.emailsrvr.com*
 - User Name—Enter your full email address (e.g., *myname@mydomain.com*).
 - Password—Enter the password associated with your email account.
5. Click the [Save](#) button.
 6. At the bottom of the resulting window, click the [Advanced](#) button.

7. In the [Mailbox Behaviors](#) section, you can “map” your iPhone email mailboxes to the associated folders stored on the email server. For each of the following mailboxes, click the arrow next to the folder name. A new window will appear, where you can select the associated “On the Server” folder:

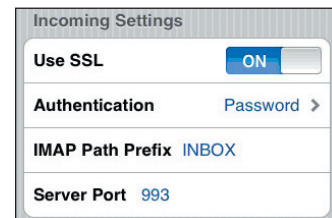


- Drafts Mailbox—Select “Drafts”
- Sent Mailbox—Select “Sent”
- Deleted Mailbox—Select “Trash”



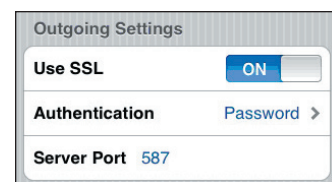
8. After specifying the mailbox behaviors, scroll down to the [Incoming Settings](#) section and enter the following information:

- Use SSL—Turn to “On”
- Authentication—Select “Password”
- IMAP Path Prefix—Select “Inbox”
- Server Port—Enter “993”



9. In the [Outgoing Settings](#) section, enter the following information:

- Use SSL—Turn to “On”
- Authentication—Select “Password”
- Server Port—Enter “587”



10. After completing these steps, you should be able to send and receive email successfully.
